Yecla Southern Spain 14% Vol.
A deep, intense, glossy, red-black wine, which is very suggestive of what is to come. A nose, full of roasted herbs, plums, sweet cassis, toasty oak and the suggestion of considerable extract. Full bodied and full flavoured on the palate, with abundant roasted herb fruits. Plenty of integrated oak and some powerful but smooth spicy tannins. There's sufficient but soft acidity which takes a back seat. Cellared here and now ready to drink.
- WM2 (3) ALOIS LAGEDER PINOT BIANCO 2006 £19.75**
Suditrol Alto Adige Northern Italy 12.5% Vol.
Alois Lageder claim their principles of sustainability are carried through from the vineyard to the wine cellar. Brilliant straw yellow colour with a green tint. Very fine, fruity (apples, peaches), forward varietal aroma. Pronounced, clean, elegant, balanced flavours, light to medium-bodied with a fresh mouth-watering finish.

1. BAJOZ, Tinta de Toro Joven, D.O. Toro, North West Spain, 2006 £19.75
(Toro is one of Spain's most exciting wine regions. Set above the Duero River, cold in winter, hot in summer. The grape is Tinta de Toro a synonym for Tempranillo. The wine is made in a brand new bodegas and with all the latest equipment, the resultant wine is a delicious soft fruit driven wine that is pleasing to the palate with an easy finish.)
2. VALPOLICELLA CLASSICO, Lamberti, Veneto Northern Italy, 2008 £19.75
(This wine is produced near Verona and Lake Garda. It is one of Italy's most popular wines. From the grapes Rondinella, Corvina and Molinara, it has a nose of ripe cherries with hints of spice and a balanced elegance of soft red fruits, acidity and soft tannin and above all drinkability)
3. CHATEAU D'ARGADENS A.C. Bordeaux Superior, 2005 £19.75
(Purchased in 2002 by sichels, this property is situated in the Entr-Deux-Mers. The excellent terroir produces robust and soft fruited wines with concentration and balance D'Argadens is one of the best Bordeaux Superieur around)

4. THE STUMP JUMP, d' Arenberg Mc Laren Vale Australia 2007 £19.75
(A Southern Rhone mix of Grenache Shiraz & Mourvèdre from Chester Osbourne chief wine maker. This is a full-bodied juicy wine with hints of cigar box on the nose, well balanced cooked fruits on the palate and a satisfying finish)
5. NORTON BARBERA, Finca la Colonia, Mendoza 2009 £19.75
(Fruity, soft balanced red with rich fruit character. Barbera is the name of the grape variety originally from Italy.)

6. FRANCONIA, Germany 2008 £19.75
(Carefully selected from only the ripest grapes of the vineyard, which is situated in a more southerly location. The wine is a revelation being soft yet crisp with beautiful floral scents and a good degree of zingy character. Excellent with or without food.)
7. ALAMOS CHARDONNAY MENDOZA, Argentina 2008 £19.75
(From the revered Catena family, this Chardonnay is from grapes grown on the low mountains of the Andes. Light oak ageing has given some vanilla nuances in the tropical and citrus fruit aromas. Lots of fruit flavours and a crisp finish)
8. DOMAINE DE BERLANDE SAUVIGNON, VdP d'Oc, J & F Lurton 2008 £19.75
(A deliciously fruity wine from the South of France with flavours of gooseberries and asparagus. Medium-bodied and fairly dry)
9. LAROCHE VIOGNIER, Beziers, Southern France, 2007 £19.75
(Originating from the Northern Rhone the Viognier grape is flourishing here in the South of France. A spicy floral and peachy nose, rich and ripe palate with hints of Apricots and a touch of spice with a rich mouth feel)
10. PINOT GRIGIO, Trentino IGT, Lamberti, Santepietre, 2008 £19.75
(Dry with a slightly honeyed nose, creamy fruit and good length)

(This wine has an attractive strawberry, raspberry colour and is full of ripe summer fruits and complexity. From a reliable and meticulous producer. Our favourite Rosé when visiting our house in Spain!)

For the lover of white wine and seafood, this is the best source of supply for good, crisp, attractive wines. Despite their coming from vineyards situated along 600 miles of France's longest river, the Loire, the wines have a remarkable likeness.

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ALSACE

Today Alsace is actually part of France and lies along the banks of the Rhine. Wonderful white wines are produced here from vines planted on the sheltered lower slopes of the Vosges mountains. In style they are more akin to French wine than German, being dry and distinctive in flavour, although in German shaped bottles. Alsace wines are named after the grape variety from which they have been made.

WHITE BORDEAUX

This area is best known for its magnificent, rich white dessert wines of Sauternes and Barsac. These seem to be regaining a well-deserved popularity for they make the perfect accompaniment to desserts and even to some rich, blue-veined cheeses such as Stilton. This section is also well worth the attention of lovers of dry white wine – those listed below are full of fruit, light, fragrant and crisp.

CLARET VINTAGES

- 2006** Good structure fruit and balance endow these wines with the ability to age well. In their youth they are a full flavour quite masculine in style.
- 2004** A very good and underrated vintage, delicious fruit and balance. Good for short and medium term drinking.
- 2003** A very warm vintage endowing the wines with great fruit and power
- 2002** A small harvest that has yielded some first-rate, well-structured, stylish wines, especially from the Médoc and the Graves, with the best wines requiring considerable cellaring before they reach their peak.
- 2001** An excellent and underrated vintage. The wines have lovely fresh juicy fruit, soft ripe tannins and lovely balance.
- 2000** The millennium vintage and what a classic! Fantastic wines with plenty of ripe rich fruit and ripe tannins. Endowing the wines with longevity but allowing them to be drunk throughout their evolution.
- 1996** Excellent weather in October led to a wonderful vintage, with the wines giving lots of character and rich ripe fruit flavors.
- 1995** The light at the end of the early 90's tunnel; far and away the best vintage since 1990. The wines are full of concentrated jammy fruit with soft, ripe tannins and excellent length and structure. They are drinking very well already though will improve with keeping. Slightly better on the right bank than the left.

RED BORDEAUX

The most prestigious wine producing area in the world. Bordeaux lies in southwestern France. The generic name of claret, given to the red wines of this area, is derived from the French word "clairet". To the connoisseur, each of the areas within the Gironde produces wines of distinct character – the St. Emilions have great flavour and bouquet and are fuller and softer than the Médocs. Pomerol wines are similar but distinct, while the full, soft, elegant Graves have much finesse and mature reasonably early.

SHERRY

Sherry comes from the southern tip of Spain, around the town of Jerez de la Frontera. It was already popular during the time of Shakespeare, as the port of Cadiz, close to Jerez, was the frontier between the Christian and Moslem regions of the time.

Sherry is made from three main grape varieties; Palomino Fino, the greatest part of the production, Pedro Ximenez and Moscatel. Sherry comes from two basic styles, Fino and Oloroso.

Fino produces the styles: Fino, Manzanilla, Amontillado and Pale Cream. Its characteristics come from the growth of a film of yeast called Flor formed on the top of the sherry in the cask. The earlier the sherry is bottled after the Flor dies or is removed, the drier and paler the sherry.

Oloroso produces the styles: Oloroso Dry/Sweet, and Cream Sherry. It is produced by stopping the Flor growing, with the fortification of the wine up to 18% volume. This makes a dark golden or amber coloured wine with a lot more body than the Fino sherries.

MANZANILLA

This is a Fino sherry, which comes from the town of Sanlucar de Barrameda on the Atlantic coast. Here the Flor grows all year. The temperature, climate of the area, imparts a delicate aroma with a salty tang.

This is a Fino sherry which is sweetened with concentrated grape must, making a medium-sweet pale sherry. This style accounts for 20% of the British sherry market.

Croft Original Pale Cream Bottle : £19.75 Glass: £3.40
Light pale gold in colour with a smooth and delicate sweet taste.

CREAM SHERRY

Cream sherries are Olorosos that are sweetened with Pedro Ximenez and Moscatel wines. This makes a dark amber, sweet sherry with a creamy taste, hence the name.

Harvey's Bristol Cream Bottle : £22.25 Glass: £3.90
A classic sherry. Dark with full rich sweet flavours and complexity.

PEDRO XIMINEZ

This grape variety is picked, placed on absorbent sheets and covered in tented polythene sheets. This reduces the water content in the grapes and increases the sugar concentration. It is then vinified in a similar way to the other Oloroso sherries, producing an extremely sweet, dark and syrupy wine which is not very often found on the British market.

Pedro Ximenez Viejo, Vinicola Hidalgo Bottle : £25.50 Glass: £4.45
Nearly black, this is amazingly intense with aromas and flavours of raisins and prunes with a deliciously lingering finish.
